When do you go on the mission?

March Break 2020 ~ February 29th – March 7th, 2020

Where do we serve?

The Bowery Mission, Lower Manhattan, NY

What's included in the registration fee?

We want your trip to be as easy on you as possible. That's why we provide the following so you don't have to:

- Lodging during the week
- All meals, except travel meals and snacks
- Themed Shirt for each participant
- Pre-trip training to prepare before we do our mission
- Experienced mission-minded leaders
- Fundraising ideas and support

Who can participate?

High School Students and young adults. If you are interested, submit an online request, only 16 seats available.

How many adults are attending?

Adults (age 20 and above) are a critical part of the experience because they help provide safety, relationships, spiritual guidance, and discipline. We bring a minimum of one adult for every five youth.

What about transportation?

We arrange transportation for the group to and from your mission trip. During the week we use local transportation.

Where do we stay?

Lodging is provided by the Mission. Accommodations will include areas for groups to room together by gender, a common eating area, and shared program area.

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Packing for a mission trip requires a lot of careful planning to make the trip a success. You will need everything we have on this list. We have also included a section of what NOT to bring...just in case you were wondering. ☐ Bedding: this will include a set of sheets (single/twin), a blanket and a pillow. Ideally these will be donated and will not be returning with you. ☐ Your Bible, pen and paper \square A week's worth of shirts, pants and undergarments. Mission Trip Packing List – 2020

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Reminders:

- Clothes should be modest and worn that way.
- No bottom of shirts tied up to expose the waist.
- Don't bring clothes that give you that "poured in" or "painted on" look. No skinny jeans.
- Jeans must be at the waist with no undergarments showing
- Girls must wear bras. The midriff should not show when bending over or raising your arms. When either standing or bending, you must have a modest top.
- No sleeveless shirts, blouses or tops. Tops must have sleeves.
- No skirts or dresses above the knee slits cannot go above the knee. Pants must be worn at the Bowery anyway.
- Tops cannot be low cut either in the front or the back. No printed T-shirts that advertise things like cigarette, beer, secular rock groups, rude or suggestive phrases or anything that would be a poor Christian testimony. This would also include rock groups even if they are Christian.

Should you choose to be a part of this mission you are not only agreeing to the statements listed above but also to the guidelines that they put in place for their volunteers listed below.

Our Purpose: We are called to minister in New York City to men, women and children in cycles of poverty, hopelessness and dependencies of many kinds, and to see their lives transformed to hope, joy, lasting productivity and eternal life through the power of Jesus Christ.

RELATIONSHIPS

Volunteers are encouraged to maintain a high standard of integrity and professionalism when relating with Community Members* (as defined below).

Volunteers are not to spend time alone with one Community Member. Volunteers should always be in the sight of others.

Volunteers are not to initiate or allow anyone to have physical contact with community members without staff advisement and the permission of the Community Member.

INFORMATION

Volunteers are asked not to share personal contact details such as home or email address, phone numbers or Facebook or Twitter account information with Community Members, while volunteering or upon their return home.

All personal information about Community Members is strictly confidential except when a Community Member shares information about matters with legal consequences such as someone being in danger or endangering others. In this case, volunteers must report the information to the staff person in charge.

CONDUCT

Our programs are violence-free and drug-free environments. Volunteers are not to smoke, drink, use drugs or carry any type of weapons on site.

Volunteers are to engage in gracious and edifying conversation. Volunteers do not swear.

As the Bowery Mission is a faith-based organization, volunteers are asked not to present or promote a worldview that is in opposition to the Judeo-Christian worldview that is the very fabric of our ministries.

Harassment of any kind is not permitted and will be subject to disciplinary action by The Bowery Mission.

The Bowery Mission is not responsible for the personal property of volunteers.

Volunteers are not to engage in a private transaction involving gifts, services or money with any Community Member. Any gifts should be directed to or channeled through the organization. Volunteers may not accept money or gifts from Community Members for services rendered.

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DRESS CODE

Volunteers must wear clothing that is deemed modest by staff. Please do not wear mid-rift revealing tops, muscle shirts or tight-fitting clothes. Shorts cannot be worn on the Mission premises at any time.

Closed toed shoes must be worn in the kitchen for safety reasons.

Clothing worn by volunteers must not portray alcohol, cigarettes, drugs, sexual or violent themes.

OUTSIDE ACTIVITES

Volunteers are not authorized to use the Bowery Mission phones, stationery, supplies and equipment for purposes not specifically related to the volunteer opportunity.

Volunteers are not authorized to identify themselves with the Bowery Mission, or attempt to use their position to gain credibility for political purposes or illicit personal gain.
